WALKING TOURS IN TALLINN

On the evening of September 29, you will have the opportunity to participate in one of our four guided walking tours introducing different regions of Tallinn. Each tour lasts about 1.5 – 2 hours and ends in an appropriately themed café or restaurant, where refreshments will be provided, giving you the chance to sample some local flavours. The tour and refreshments will be free of charge. If you wish, you can also stay and enjoy dinner at the restaurant of your choice at your own expense.



Tallinn Old Town

During this tour, you can learn about the history and iconic sights of the Old Town. Unlike many other capital cities in Europe, Tallinn has managed to wholly preserve its structure of medieval and Hanseatic origin. Here you'll find original cobblestone streets dotted with medieval churches and grandiose merchant houses, barns and warehouses many of which date back to the Middle Ages.

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Kalamaja & the Culture Kilometre

Often considered a hipster area of Tallinn, Kalamaja is best known for its colourful wooden houses, bohemian charm and industrial heritage. Kalamaja has served as the city's main fishing port from the Middle Ages onward. In 1870, the Tallinn-St. Petersburg railway was completed, and large factories sprang up in the district. This industrial heritage has only added to Kalamaja's intrigue. During this tour, you can also visit the Baltic Station Market, packed with stalls and restaurants, antique and design shops.



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Telliskivi Creative City

This tour of Telliskivi Creative City is a good opportunity to experience the repurposed industrial buildings that Northern Tallinn is famous for. The factory buildings have become a popular meeting place for those who enjoy unique restaurants, art exhibitions, draft beers, design and vintage shops, alternative theatre and club events. It is a well-known leisure place for city dwellers and visitors to the city, where design, music, art and open-mindedness meet; an independent business centre located on the territory of the former industrial complex belonging to the Baltic Railways.

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Kadriorg Park & Reidi tee

This 18th-century park is located in a romantic inner-city area nearby the coast. Kadriorg palace and art museum surrounded by manicured Kadriorg Park was once established by Tsar Peter the Great as a manifestation of love. The park features fountains and streams, and is surrounded by equally historical wooden houses.

The tour will also take you to the newly constructed Reidi tee, a waterfront promenade next to the park, where recreation areas have been created for families and walkers.

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
